



Every Drunkard Hinders the Millenium

In the decades leading up the American Civil War, alcohol consumption was excessive due to its low cost. Many evangelical Christians were concerned that alcoholism prevented the Republic from thriving and believed it was their duty to reform society. Many evangelicals saw this problem through the lens of millennialism. 
